Hello everybody!

I can't believe this is the end of the first half of the summer term. It would normally have been a busy time with SATS and assessments but instead it has been further adjusting to life at home.



School has remained a hive of activity with the children of key workers attending every day and will remain so over the half term break.

Next week as it is half term there will be **no work provided on Eschools** as was the case for the Easter break.

From June 1 we could be welcoming back children from Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 6 into school. From that date, **all children** will be expected to wear uniform, including the key worker group.

The plans for coming back to school will be emailed later today (Friday) to the parents directly involved. This will include a letter about the arrangements specific for your child, a booklet for the children so they know what to expect and a general plan outlining how school will operate during the planned extension of opening. **It all remains subject to the governments decision expected later next week.** A generic of the plan and the measures we are taking at this time will be sent out with this newsletter and will be available on the school website in the Parent and Community sections. This will enable parents of children in Years 2-5 to see what is happening in school.

Our aim in providing this information to parents is to enable you to make an informed decision about your child's return and also to be able to talk to them about what school will be like. It will not be school as they remember it. It will look and feel very different. We will endeavour to maintain the warmth of our school but with social distancing in place—this will be tricky.

Thank you for your continued support throughout this time. It means a lot to the staff team.
