I am delighted to report that we are now graded a GOOD SCHOOL! As you know, we have been working hard to address the key issues from the last OFSTED report and have kept you up to date with our progress following the HMI visits by Mr Pye. From our initial monitoring visit in Autumn 2017 we have had our eyes firmly set on coming out of Special Measures as good as we recognised we had the potential to do so. That said, it has not been an easy journey and the staff and children have had to work relentlessly to keep building on their achievements.
