Bullying

Excellent behaviour in our schools

At Wood End, we have been working incredibly hard to improve the behaviour of pupils around school and from speaking to pupils and to people who visit our school, there has been an improvement since the start of this year. OSFTED recognised that bullying in our school is extremely rare and where it is reported, action is taken by school immediately.

In saying that, in almost every organisation (including those most adults work in) bullying is present in some shape or form. Any school or any organisation which says 'we have no bullying' probably has a poor understanding of what it is or sweeping it under the carpet. Our role is to ensure that we give children an understanding of what it is, the power and support to tackle it and create a climate where it is totally unacceptable and if it occurs it is extremely rare and stamped out immediately.

Children and adults often get the definition of 'bullying' wrong and use what is a very strong 'description' wrongly. Whilst adults say 'my child is being bullied', in reality what is happening is usually children bickering or arguing with each other and the wrong term is being used. Bullying is not usually a 'single isolated incident', but is something that is more likely to be targeted, planned and repeated. Our schools operate in an extremely ordered and friendly environment, with a really strong system for stopping things occurring before they grow. We use 'Stop it Please!' as a first line of defence to let someone know we don't like an action. and then a procedure to report to staff and parents, with support for the person experiencing unpleasant behaviour.

Thankfully, over the past three years our 'bullying logs' show only a handful of incidents, which is a result that we are very proud of. However, we are never complacent and will continue to work hard to ensure that our children treat each other with the highest levels of respect.

The most important thing to remember is that if you have any concerns over the wellbeing of your child, talk to your child's teacher in the first instance or book an appointment to speak to a senior member of staff. The sooner we know there is a problem, the sooner we can address it within school.
