Healthy Schools

It is essential that children receive the appropriate nutrition in order to grow and develop healthily. As a school we are committed to promoting the health and wellbeing of all pupils.

It has become apparent over recent weeks that lunchboxes and morning snacks are becoming less healthy. After Easter we will be rewarding children for healthy snacks and lunchtime choices.

Morning Snack

Children up to Year 2 are provided with a piece of fruit every day. School has no choice over which fruit is available but there is enough for every child to have one piece each. For older children, you are able to send in a small healthy snack. This includes fruit, a Frube (or its equivalent) or 2 plain biscuits (i.e. without cream or chocolate coating or filling) Children are asked to drink from their water bottles. Children should not be consuming crisps, sandwiches, etc. which are intended for lunch.

Lunchboxes

Change for Life has lots of tips and recipes for a healthy lunchbox.

Chocolate bars and fizzy drinks are not permitted in a lunchbox.

Ideally children should be having a sandwich/ wrap, at least 2 of their 5 a day and a healthy drink. A healthy lunchbox sets your child up for a productive afternoon. Too much sugar or carbohydrate can influence their learning behaviour.

Alternatively, children can access our delicious school meals which are carefully balanced and in line with current food guidelines.
