Curriculum

The children are now well established in their new classrooms and the routines that are in place. Now we can turn attention to our core purpose - teaching. We are aware that children have missed a significant proportion of their learning last year whether they were in school or at nursery. However, our staff are highly skilled at identifying gaps and addressing these to ensure children catch up.

At our schools, we remain committed to a broad and balanced curriculum. We recognise the importance of the core skills but rather than ignore all of the other areas of the curriculum, we are building basic skills into these subjects where we can but also adding in extra short sharp bursts to refresh the children's recall of things they knew before lockdown.

We continue to use Cornerstones as the basis for our curriculum. Each class will study a theme each term learning key skills from the National Curriculum in a wide range of subjects. This will be supported by a quality text that introduces the children to new vocabulary and exciting adventures. For maths we adopt a mastery approach using Mathematics Mastery in Years R- 3 and White Rose Maths in Y4-6.

Over the coming weeks, we will identify the children who may need a little more support to 'catch up' and will use the funds allocated in the most effective way we can to maximise the progress of our children.

It is quite nice to write about something other than the C- word and for once this isn't Christmas in September. It almost feels like business as usual.

1	I have tested positive for Covid-19	YES – 10 days and 48hours clear of high temperature
2	I have developed a symptom and not yet tested.	YES – until you test negative – if the test is positive follow scenario 1 above.
3	I have been told I am a close contact of a case.	YES – 14 days
4	I am a close contact of someone who has tested positive. I have been tested and I am negative	YES – for 14 days unless you develop symptoms and then test positive (see number 1)
5	A household member has developed symptoms and not yet tested.	YES – until they test negative – if the test is positive household isolates for 14 days
6	A household member has been told to isolate as a close contact	NO – be vigilant, if they start to develop symptoms then you will need to isolate until they test and its negative.
7	I visited someone, within 2m, who has now been told to isolate as a close contact	NO – the person was not symptomatic. If within 48 hours of the visit they develop symptoms and test positive, follow number 3.
8	My sibling is in another class bubble and needs to isolate due to positive Covid 19 case in their class. I am in a different class bubble.	NO – they are not themselves a close contact of a positive case, if their sibling develops symptoms then they need to isolate as per number 5.
