Anti-bullying Week

This week in school we have been discussing Cyber bullying in assemblies and class, as part of Anti-bullying week.

Cyber bullying is any form of bullying which takes place online or through smartphones and tablets. Social networking sites, messaging apps, gaming sites and chat rooms such as Facebook, XBox Live, Instagram, YouTube, Snapchat and other chat rooms can be great fun and a positive experience.

But what can children do when things go wrong?

Cyber bullying is rife on the internet and most young people will experience it or see it at some time. In a recent national bullying survey, 56% of young people said they have seen others be bullied online and 42% have felt unsafe online. Cyber bullying can happen 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and it can go viral very fast. Cyber bullying is more of a problem for children at s econdary school age, but is becoming an issue for younger children too. There are many ways of bullying someone online and for some it can take shape in more ways than one.

Harassment - This is the act of sending offensive, rude, and insulting messages and being abusive. Nasty or humiliating comments on posts, photos and in chat rooms. Being explicitly offensive on gaming sites.

Denigration – This is when someone may send information about another person that is fake, damaging and untrue. Sharing photos of someone for the purpose to ridicule, spread fake rumours and gossip.

Impersonation – This is when someone will hack into someone's email or social networking account and use the person's online identity to send or post vicious or embarrassing material to/about others.

Outing and Trickery – This is when someone may share personal information about another or trick someone into revealing secrets and forward it to others.

Cyber Stalking - This is the act of repeatedly sending messages that include threats of harm or harassment.

Exclusion – This is when others intentionally leave someone out of a group such as group messages, online apps, gaming sites and other online engagement.


As you know the effects of bullying can have a massive impact on all individuals, whether that is at school or socially. Anti-bullying week has been a great way to get involved, take a stand against bullying and raise awareness. At Wood End we ask our children to follow our one word school rule - consideration, whenever they use the internet or are online. If children ever experience cyber bullying are advice would be to tell someone they trust straight away, do not retaliate, take a screen shot if possible and use the report button if the site has one. Most sites now have a report button and this will send the bullying comments to the site to investigate. We also teach children to use our SMART rules to keep themselves safe online.
