Safeguarding

In our school we take the safeguarding of pupils very seriously. We maintain a 'culture of vigilance' noticing changes in children whether they are significant or small.

Each school has Designated Safeguarding Leads (DSL) whose job it is to act on any reports from staff and decide on appropriate actions. Their training is kept up to date and our safeguarding team across our two schools meet regularly to discuss the ongoing position. The team is Mrs Cross, Miss McGroarty (Dordon), Mrs Smith (Wood End) and Mrs Lewis (SENDCo).

We also teach the children through the curriculum about their right to feel safe all of the time. We give them the language of safety and will talk to them often about their Early Warning Signs and the importance of talking to people on their network. As the DSL, this makes it much easier to talk to the children about how they are feeling. The lessons for this will take place this term but we revisit it across the academic year.

All staff in school receive safeguarding training and know the signs of abuse. They all know the process for reporting their concerns. They follow these regularly because their number one priority and concern are the children in their care.

We are an OPERATION ENCOMPASS school, this means that if there is an incident of domestic abuse or violence where children are present to which the police are called, the school receives a notification. We take no further action other than to keep an extra eye on the child and offer support if they need it.

It is as important that I keep you, as parents, up to date with our commitment to safeguarding as it is that I train staff. You need to know that we are committed to the safeguarding of all the children in our care so I take the opportunity at least once a year to remind you of what we do and the reason we do it. ALL children deserve to feel safe all of the time.

Spotlight on Otter Class

Today in Science, we were doing an experiment to find out why birds have different beaks. The experiment was using bulldog clips and the trays were filled to the top with seeds. That's when we (Matthew and Ewan) used the bulldog clips as our equipment to grabs as many seeds out of the tray as we could in 30 seconds. The clips represented different sized bird beaks. (******************************

We also did some research on different bird beaks. We found out that birds need different shaped beaks to catch different food depending on their habitat and that their shapes have evolved over many years. For example, the Curlew bird has a long beak to catch earthworms, grasshoppers etc that live in the mud. (We also found out that flamingos need to eat something to turn pink and that baby birds are adorable!)

Our investigation showed that the bigger beaks (bulldog clips) can pick up more than the smaller beaks. We also found that the number of seeds you pick up each time can be different which makes us wonder if it is a fair test.

| 1 | I have tested positive for Covid-19 | YES – 10 days and 48hours clear of high temperature |
| 2 | I have developed a symptom and not yet tested. | YES – until you test negative – if the test is positive follow scenario 1 above. |
| 3 | I have been told I am a close contact of a case. | YES – 14 days |
| 4 | I am a close contact of someone who has tested positive. I have been tested and I am negative | YES – for 14 days unless you develop symptoms and then test positive (see number 1) |
| 5 | A household member has developed symptoms and not yet tested. | YES – until they test negative – if the test is positive household isolates for 14 days |
| 6 | A household member has been told to isolate as a close contact | NO – be vigilant, if they start to develop symptoms then you will need to isolate until they test and its negative. |
| 7 | I visited someone, within 2m, who has now been told to isolate as a close contact | NO – the person was not symptomatic. If within 48 hours of the visit they develop symptoms and test positive, follow number 3. |
| 8 | My sibling is in another class bubble and needs to isolate due to positive Covid 19 case in their class. I am in a different class bubble. | NO – they are not themselves a close contact of a positive case, if their sibling develops symptoms then they need to isolate as per number 5. |
