That Time of Year

I cannot quite believe that we are at SATS week again. It doesn't seem like 5 minutes since I was writing a similar article last year. SATS are the statutory tests that are completed at the end of both Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2. The children are tested in Reading, Writing, Grammar and Mathematics.

At Key Stage 2, the process is conducted very much like GCSE examinations, with strict guidance on when they can be administered and how this must be done. ALL staff in school have received training about the procedures around these tests in case they are involved in the administration. For some pupils, where it is appropriate, school have applied for additional time to ensure the pupils fulfil their potential. There are strict regulations around this and school have followed the application process to the letter. For those pupils, they have been prepared well and understand how the process works.

At Key Stage 1, there are equally stringent guidelines about the storage and sharing of test materials but the tests can be completed at any time in May. At our school we have opted for the week beginning the 20th May.

The tests are to provide school and the wider world about the progress that has been made by pupils within our school and the outcomes they have achieved. The data is used to construct league tables however school judgments from OFSTED are less reliant on outcomes and are more focussed about the current picture in school. This worked in our favour during our recent inspection at Wood End.

As with everything, our staff and pupils have approached these tests with a positive attitude and everyone understands that they are 'just a piece of paper.' We are not a school that limits the curriculum in Year 6 to only focus on English and Maths. The outcomes we achieve will simply be a reflection of our children at that moment in time. All we ask is that children do 'their best'. We aim to make them as relaxed as possible and look forward to celebrating the outcomes with children and parents in July.
