Behaviour at Wood End

Since I became involved with Wood End, I have been reporting to you regularly that I can see an improvement in behaviour. This week I have asked a range of children across school THEIR opinions on the matter and I wanted to share with you their responses.

What is behaviour like at Wood End?

It needs to be perfect but it is not perfect all of the time yet. (Y6)

People are using 'Stop it Please' more. (Y6)

School is calm. (Y3)

Good because you have had some people in your office and you sorted it out and made it better. (Y3)

Good because people help each other on the playground and in class. (Y1)

What happens if you behave well?

Get stars, stickers and certificates. (Y1)

Might get the postcard home, dining room diamond or lunchtime hero awards. (Y4)

Get sent to the Headteacher to show something good. (Y3)

Teachers smile. (Y1)

Some children, who need extra support, get reward time to show they have been good.

It is what they need to help them. (Y6)

What happens if you don't behave well?

You will move to the yellow and then the red face. (Y1)

There is always a consequence which is fair. We need to learn what is the right thing to do. (Y6)

You may get sent to Mrs Cross. (Y5)

People will say 'Stop it Please' (Y3)

How do teachers help you to behave?

Help us sort out issues. (Y3)

Tell you what you have done so you can put it right. (Y3)

Tell us what we need to be doing. It is clear. (Y1)

Knowing there is someone in charge helps us to behave. (Y6)

Encourage us to use 'Stop It Please'. (Y4)

We know what being good looks like. (Y5)

How can we make behaviour even better?

Give us skills to solve our problems. (Y6)

Year 6 needs to be good role models. (Y6)

Children need to be more responsible and stop talking when the teacher is. (Y5)

Talk to children more about how they should behave. (Y3)

Do pupils at Wood End show RESPECT?

Almost all of the time (Y3)

Only 5 children don't. (Y1)

Most of the time, about 85%. (Y6)

It is clear that the children can see the improvements that have been made too. There is still work to do but as our systems become more embedded and the children are more familiar with expectations, I am confident it will continue to improve.
