

Spotlight on Fox Class The Animal Man

To wrap up our Predator theme, we had a very exciting zoom call with an animal expert. The children met both predators and prey and learnt how these animals survive in the wild. The children met Bill the Gecko, Miss Fluffy the Tarantula and many more animals. We then were taken around the animal sanctuary to see some other furry and feathery animals. The children met a not so smelly Skunk, Barn Owls, Tawny Owls and a Snowy Owl. We also walked past a cheeky Llama, zoom bombing our predator talk. To finish the children were given the opportunity to ask the animal expert questions, with a surprise visit from the original 'Animal Man' who was very impressed with our Predator knowledge.

"Cuckoo birds lay their eggs in another birds nest, then when it hatches it throws the other eggs out. "
