<u>Going the extra mile to support our children with Reading</u> <u>Skills in conjunction with Ocado.</u>

Last year 100% of our children in Year 1 met the expected standard for the Phonics Screening Check and our Year 2 and 6 Reading SATs results were of an extremely high standard.

I am amazed by the continuing talent that our children show across all classes from Nursery to year 6 in all aspects of their Reading. Their decoding skills, their use of synthetic phonics leading to their comprehension and understanding and most difficult of all, their inferential skills-being able to read between the lines and find the deeper meaning within a text; these are all skills that are taught on a consistent basis to our children.

An amazing prospect for us is our growing link with Ocado. In a recent meeting with Liam O' Mahony, Senior Operations Manager, Simon Morrison, Services Manager and Natasha Grogan, Support Assistant, we have agreed that several employees from Ocado on a regular basis will support children's individual reading sessions at Wood End.

We are very fortunate to be further developing a relationship with this well regarded, local business.

Examples of this could be reading on top of a mountain, under a waterfall, reading upside down!! Bullying

Excellent behaviour in our schools

Our schools have been recognised for the children's 'Outstanding behaviour' (OFSTED) and a time when the behaviour of pupils in schools nationally has become a real concern we aim to keep it this way.

Bullying is thankfully extremely rare in our schools, but in almost every organisation (including those most adults work in) it is present in some shape or form. Any school or any organisation which says 'we have no bullying' probably has a poor understanding of what it is or sweeping it under the carpet Our role is to ensure that we give children an understanding of what it is, the power and support to tackle it and create a climate where it is totally unacceptable and if it occurs it is extremely rare and stamped out immediately.

Children and adults often get the definition of 'bullying' wrong and use what is a very strong 'description' wrongly. Whilst adults say 'my child is being bullied', in reality what is happening is usually children bickering or arguing with each other and the wrong term is being used. Bullying is not usually a ' single isolated incident', but is something that is more likely to be targeted, planned and repeated. Our schools operate in an extremely ordered and friendly environment, with a really strong system for stopping things occurring before they grow. We use 'Stop it Please!' as a first line of defence to let someone know we don't like an action, and then a procedure to report to staff and parents, with support for the person experiencing unpleasant behaviour.

Thankfully, over the past five years our 'bullying logs' show less than a handful of incidents, which is an extraordinary result that we are very proud of. However, we are never complacent and will continue to work hard to ensure that our children treat each other with the highest levels of respect.

Whilst we are confident that our children can meet the 'new challenges' well, the bar has been sent very high indeed. Parents should be aware that children who previously were graded as 'exceeding national expectations' may now fit closer into what is described as 'meeting national averages'. Be reassured, the children are not 'doing worse', are not failing, and teaching is still fantastic. We are simply being asked to measure them against a far more challenging standard.
