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#### Welcome back to the academic year 2016-17

We wish everyone a warm welcome back to school in what is sure to be an extremely exciting year for our schools. During the Summer there has been a great deal going in readiness for this year, as well as some exiting academy news.

On September 1st we were delighted that two further schools joined our academy and we offer a warm welcome to Chadsmead Academy in Lichfield and The Wilnecote School in Wilnecote, who are sure to bring valuable expertise and further opportunities for our children, staff and communities. We have also been doing a great deal of work towards opening a brand new school which will be known as 'Heathcote Primary School', and will open in Warwick next September.

Over the Summer a great deal of work has been carried out in our schools, ensuring that they are fantastic places for our children. Apart from being 'deep cleaned' throughout, across our schools we have painted and decorated toilets, corridors and classrooms, replaced carpets, replaced lighting in classrooms and corridors, purchased new tables and chairs and also bought some fantastic new resources for the children. In addition, some of our schools have benefitted from capital funds, exclusive to academies, which have allowed is to have whole new heating systems, new fire alarm systems, new roofs and toilet facilities. Many of these are beyond most schools extremely tight budgets.

Our staff have given over a great deal of time during the holiday to prepare the school. A selection of comments and misconceptions we sometimes face 'It is the school's job to teach my child and not mine!'

Surprisingly we have heard this as an argument for a child not completing homework at home! In reality parents ARE the first educators, teaching children to smile, talk, walk and eat! Education is a partnership between home and school and we really really need parents to help their child progress rapidly by hearing them read EACH week and often as possible, helping with homework, preparing them for maths tests and all manner of other activities such as looking up areas of work being covered in school.

We don't ask much. A 15 minute reading session each week, a couple of homework tasks and talk to them daily about what they did at school. It makes a huge difference.

Weekly Safety Question ... Each week we ask the children a quick 'outside of school' safety question and we help them answer it. We would be grateful if parents could help us at home by giving the same message. This week:

'What happens if you have started walking home on your own and you can't get in the house when you get there?'
