return of children to school. It is still unclear which children will be prioritised and what the restrictions will be for schools.

Social Distancing for Children

We have been social distancing in school since we opened for key worker and vulnerable children. We have explained it using the concept of a bubble and we will do the same with all children as their return. The idea being that they must protect their bubble if someone is too close then your bubble will pop! We use the phrase 'Watch my bubble please' and the children know they are too close. It might be an idea to start using this with your child so they are familiar with the concept before

coming back into the school environment. We find it effective.
