Broad and Balanced Curriculum

At our school, we strive to provide a curriculum that gives our pupils a balanced approach in their learning. We value all of the subjects of the National Curriculum and understand that children in our care have different strengths, skills and talents. As a caring school, we intend to recognise and nurture children's talents and provide vehicles to showcase and develop them.

To support the implementation our curriculum design, we use the Cornerstones Curriculum which provides exciting theme work during our non-core lessons. The focus of our teaching is very much centred around age related skills but the chosen themes are engaging and allow children to explore a wide range of topics from the Ancient Greeks, to recycling, to World War 2 and many more. Your children will be able to talk about the exciting learning they complete as part of their theme. We also use Cornerstones Love to Celebrate and Love to Investigate to provide interesting learning opportunities in RE and Science. Again, whilst it is engaging, the teaching concentrates on the skills of these subjects and ensures children are gaining age-appropriate skills in a planned sequence.

To further enhance the curriculum we utilise specialists and incorporate trips and visitors to bring our children the best experiences we can. This includes them working with visiting artists, having sports coaches to support the teaching in PE, working alongside the Birmingham Hippodrome to enhance performance and visiting a wide range of settings for our school trips.

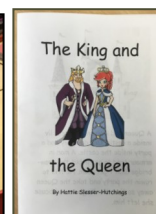

One of the key British Values for modern Britain is the **Rule of Law**.




