
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

Stranger Danger

Ensuring that we do our very best to keep children safe

We are immensely proud of our excellent record for keeping our children safe. During our inspections OFSTED have described our work in this area in our academy schools as 'outstanding' and told us that our children feel very safe in school and well looked after. We are keen to share the best in our schools and make sure that all of our schools reach the highest standards.

We complete a great deal of this work in this area. Apart from maintaining an excellent level of physical security, we also carry out regular reviews. At each weekly staff meeting 'safeguarding' is a 'standing item' and we also regularly remind our colleagues of their responsibility through training sessions.

We do not however 'guarantee' absolute security. Schools are not military establishments, we don't have security guards and we need to make sure that we are accessible to literally hundreds of individuals every single day. We also need to make sure that our environment is inspiring, exciting and loved by our children. A prison we are not! In school our aim is to decrease risk to an absolute minimum by making sure we restrict entrances, ensure adults in school are 'DBS checked', children are always supervised, reminding parents not to drop children off early or collect late and all manner of other measures.

Perhaps our greatest weapon is however in teaching children how to cope with 'dangers'. If they can avoid problems or be taught how to deal with them, they will avoid getting themselves in trouble and will remain safe. Each week we provide a 'keeping safe reminder'; we have many assemblies about 'safety' and teach them that when in trouble they DO NOT avoid 'strangers' but find the 'safest stranger.
